
### Sad Day at Red Oak II

I have one full time neighbor. Now there are several fine folks that have purchased property here in Red Oak II, and will be moving here soon. But, for right now, I have only one neighbor, that's a man whom I could talk with, dream out loud with, and work together with on Red Oak II projects. His name is "Tom Klinginsmith".

Now Tom is my attorney, and long, long time friend as well as neighbor. Tom passed away Saturday night, June 28, 2008. Now I could fill pages, telling you the praises of this fine man. But out of this sadness, comes this one beautiful short story.

Saturday, June 28th, was Tom's daughter's wedding day. After the wedding, and an exhausting day. Tom with his wife Carol, returned home late that evening. They found Tom's golden retriever Sandy, friend and companion of 14 years, with her life quickly ebbing away. From the moment Tom & Carol returned home, until 2:00 A.M. in the morning, Tom held Sandy in his arms, comforting and caressing her. Finally Tom climbed the stairs to bed, telling Carol that he had made a pallet for Sandy, and she was sleeping comfortably. But, just as Tom and Carol were dozing off to sleep, they heard a couple of loud crashes and a big kerrthunk! They both jumped out of bed and went to the stairs, to find that Sandy had tried to climb up the stairs to Tom, and had fallen backwards. Tom. once again held Sandy in his arms, petting her head and saying, "Ole gal, thanks for all the good years!" Then Sandy died peacefully in Tom's arms. Tom carried his friend out and put her in his old truck so as to bury her in the morning, and then Tom returned to bed. The next morning, Carol told me that when Tom got back in bed with her, she could feel him trembling. She thought he was sobbing over the loss of his friend, Sandy. Instead he was having a heart attack in his sleep. Tom died an hour after his beloved dog Sandy. I've lost my dear friend and neighbor. Tom was the most generous, humble, honest and kind man that I have ever met. And I loved him and I'm sure going to miss him! But I know Tom and his dog Sandy, are now walking the fields of Heaven, smiling down at Red Oak II!

With all this rain, the grass keeps growing so quickly that Lowell seems to always be out mowing.




### The Canadians Invade Red Oak II


