There is always a lot going on at Red Oak II. Here are the happenings of the third quarter of 2008:

Red Oak II Renovations Continue

The poor little Elmira school house watched all the other buildings here at Red Oak II being put back to brand new condition while she just sat there with years of neglect and rot. But now it's Elmira's turn. The new owners of the Elmira school house gave her a face lift and WOW, what a face lift she got. All of her old rotted shingles, siding and window sills have been ripped out and replaced and she was given a much deserved new coat of paint.

Due to the economy, selling prices at the auction tended to not be as high as they typically have been in past years. Despite this, Lowell's magnificent oil painting "Covey Break" did very well and sold for \$1,800.

Lowell's daughter April Davis is also an exceptional artist, creating magnificent, highly detailed sculptures and more recently getting into oil painting. April's auction piece was a sculpture entitled "Summer Showers". It also did very well selling for \$1,500.












