

Restoration of Lowell Davis Cold Cast Porcelain Figurines



The Backsliders Giclée Prints

Sam Butcher recently gave "The Backsliders" back to Lowell. If you recall from his autobiography, this is the painting that Lowell exchanged with Sam for \$10,000 which Lowell needed for a down payment on the cabin. The Backsliders is a magnificent, 48" x 48" painting which depicts Red Oak II in the winter. When you are visiting Red Oak II, ask Lowell to show it to you and tell you the story that it depicts.






